### England - York St. John University

City: York

Language: English

York St. John began as York Diocesan Training School in 1841 and now enrolls about 6,400 students, boasting some of the top scores in teaching quality in the country. It has a rapidly growing research program for Education. York itself is a quaint and historic walled city that has much to be explored including its famous York Minster cathedral, The Shambles, various cultural sites relating to its Roman and Viking background, many historic pubs and cafes, and a beautiful surrounding countryside.

### **Ecuador** - Universidad San Francisco de Quito (BCA)

City: Quito

Language: Spanish

Universidad San Francisco de Quito is Ecuador's only liberal arts university. Students can learn how teach Spanish as a second language while improving their own skills. The city of Quito is home to two million people and is known as the City of the Sun and Sky. Quito is a diverse city that includes an urban park larger than Central Park and is surrounded by mountains. Students will improve their Spanish skills while immersed in their homestays.

### Germany - Philipps-Universität Marburg

It is also one of the oldest universities in Germany, founded in 1527. Marburg itself is a university town. Students can explore part of the Fairytale Path, in honor of the alumni the Brothers Grimm.
