# England - York St. John University

City: York

Language: English

York St. John began as York Diocesan Training School in 1841 and now enrolls about 6,400 students, boasting some of the top scores in teaching quality in the country. The writing courses at YSJ are also supplemented with the presence of industry professionals. The campus is right in the middle of the city, a stone's throw from the famous York Minster Cathedral. Students can also visit The Shambles, a network of Victorian alleys within the city.
