England - University Of Leeds

City: Leeds

Language: English

Around 30,000 students attend University of Leeds, which specializes in physical sciences and languages, and has a strong tradition in research. Faculty-Led Short-Term Course Abroad

Culture, Class, & Gender to India/Thailand 3 cr.

Location: Kaohsiung, Taichung, Tainan, Taipei City

This course will examine the role of gender in development by exploring current debates and approaches relating to Gender, Development, and Empowerment, particularly as it applies in the coastal setting of south east India and coastal Thailand. This short-term course trip will last between 14-17 days and will include firsthand learning experiences through visits to Kochin in India, and Bangkok and Phuket in Thailand.

Australia- University of Newcastle

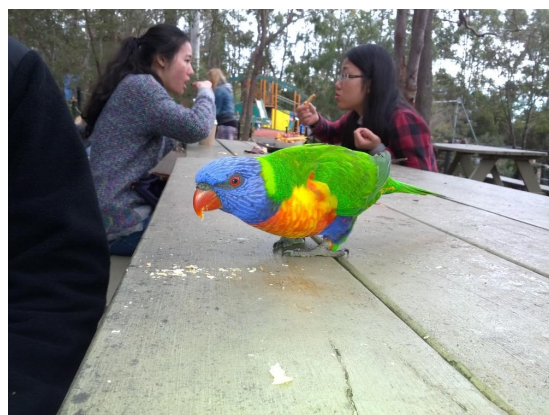
City: Newcastle
