Intern of the Month

Over the summer of 2015 Juniata student Maris Wilson worked with the non-profit organization MyFarm in the Gambia. Maris was interested in an internship that was located in The Gambia and that focused on the country's agriculture. MyFarm offered the opportunity to learn about agricultural products in The Gambia and how non-profits affect the sustainability of Gambian agriculture. While there, she learned about processing the copious amount of mangoes on the farm into jam, chutney, and dried mango. Maris also helped train Gambian women in soap making and mango drying; in order for them to take their skills back to their home villages and make the products to sell locally. Other tasks included general farm work, such as watering the gardens, weeding, and planting. Maris took from the experience knowledge of the agricultural community in The Gambia, as well as an appreciation for the ease of success in America. She also learned the importance for non-profits and other organizations to talk with the community they are trying to help in order to be the most effective.

Maris plans to graduate in the spring of 2017 and would like to work with a non-profit and or international organization in the future. She states, "I'm not sure where my path will lead after graduation, but I hope that it will be towards a career in international agriculture."
