# Intern of the Month

Currently, Juniata alum Emily Evey is participating in a human resources internship at Wolf Trap Foundation for the Performing Arts. Emily was first introduced to the company during her sophomore year when a Juniata alumnus, who worked in the Education department for Wolf Trap, came to visit. Ms. Evey was drawn in by the description of the job, as well as to the company's mission statement, "To present and create excellent and innovative performing arts programs for the enrichment, education, and enjoyment of diverse audiences and participants." Her responsibilities and projects change on a constant basis, but currently she is working on the analysis of employee performance evaluations, helping to create solutions for challenges with employees, working with and handling confidential paper work, and helping to create and research events for employee appreciation. She enjoys being able to use her problem-solving and analytical skills to help the Wolf Trap Foundations better understand challenges that employees have and how to create solutions. Emily was surprised by how interested she was in the field; though she does do some paper pushing, these tasks are balanced out by more interesting work.

Named "One of the Best Places to Intern" by Bloomberg BusinessWeek, Wolf Trap offers paid, full-time internship positions during the summer as well as paid, part-time internship positions during the fall and spring. Wolf Trap interns have gone on to positions at major arts organizations, such as The Kennedy Center and American Ballet Theatre. They can offer benefits such as; paid stipend, college credit, career development workshops, free tickets to select performances, free master class participation and observation, and more.

Emily graduated with a POE titled Theatre, Communication, and Social Justice. She states, "I personally have come to appreciate my time at Juniata and fighting to create the major I envisioned. I have also found that I cannot just help people through the arts, but I can give back to people in the arts." She plans to keep making connections within the theatre community in hopes of honing her craft as an artist and staff member behind the scenes.

#### **Summer Job Internship?**

Do you know that your summer job could also double as an internship? Even if you find the position on your own without assistance from the Career Services Office, it could qualify as a non-credit,

transcript-notation internship.

Essentially, in order to qualify as an internship, a summer job must: Last a minimum of 240 hours, consist of pre-professional and academically-valid responsibilities related to your POE, and be performed in accordance with guidelines—The job can be a paid

OR volunteer position. If approved, a summer internship will appear on your official transcript (without grade or credit), and can be advantageous in the future as prospective employers, graduate schools, and similar persons review your transcript. Having a summer job qualify as an internship requires the satisfactory completion of various criteria. If you are interested in pursuing internship qualification, please
