Checklist

- ☐ Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) If you are applying for need-based financial aid, submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. File the FASFSA as soon as possible to ensure that you have your financial information with plenty of time to review it before the May 1 deposit deadline. If you have questions about the FAFSA or paying for your education, call the Office of Student Financial Planning at 814-641-3142. Juniata's code number for the FAFSA is 003279.
- ☐ Schedule a campus visit

 If you've never been to campus, or if it's been awhile since you visited, you may want to schedule a visit to take a closer look and meet our students and your professors. You can attend one of our many in-person or virtual connection opportunities.

- ☐ Review your Financial Planning Award

 If you have filed the FAFSA you will receive a financial aid award.

 Please review the award carefully, and if you have questions, feel free to contact or the Office of Student Financial Planning.
- Notify Juniata of your college selection

 officially matriculate, return the enclosed form with your final
 decision along with the \$400 deposit or deposit online at
 apply.juniata.edu/status. Don't forget to contact all the colleges
 to which you've been admitted and let them know of your choice
 on or before May 1. Consider depositing early as housing
 assignments are made in order of deposit received date.



Frequently Asked Questions About Preparing for Your First Semester at Juniata

What documentation will I need to provide before my first semester?

Submit your final high school transcript upon graduation
Juniata must have an official final high school transcript with a
graduation date. Federal and state financial aid funds require us
to have this on file before the student attends full time in the fall.

Transfer credits, AP, and IB curriculum

If you have taken college courses, please send an official transcript from that institution to the enrollment office. AP credits are accepted with a score of 4 or 5 on the exam. Full IB diplomas are accepted, as are higher level courses with a test score of 5, 6, or 7. Class substitution is determined with the consultation of professors and advisers. Please have the testing organization send test scores directly to Juniata's Registrar.

What will living at college be like?

Living at a residential college is an opportunity. While traditions and clubs will help you integrate into the Juniata community, learning to live away from home will empower you to discover who you are. The first step is to request your residence hall. Explore more: www.juniata.edu/offices/res-life.

Consider your housing options:

Sherwood Hall is exclusive to first-year students and co-ed by floor, and has a great first year community.

The majority of students living in **Sunderland Hall** are first-year students and this hall is also co-ed by wing. In addition to the standard common area, Sunderland has a kitchen that is available to residents for late night snacks and get togethers.

Tussey and Terrace Halls, commonly known as T&T, are open to all students. Co-ed by wing, with a gender inclusive option, they house the Global Village, learning and living communities where students can choose to have an international roommate. The T&T lounge is a popular location for fun campus activities.

Cloister Hall, the only all-female dorm, can be found on the guad.

Unlike all the other residence halls, **East Halls** offer suite-style housing options. Typically, four traditional rooms are connected through a private common area and shared bathroom.
