1:42 PM	Administration Comments	President Troha talked about the key focuses and needs of the College and how council has helped drive and move toward these key focus areas Giving Thanked for helping with the double giving campaign Enrollment Jim talked about how competitive the higher education market is getting We are starting to see institutions that increased financial aid after the May 1 deadline We have seen institutions sending letters to students who deposited elsewhere stating that, if unhappy with package, they would be happy to talk to them Key Juniata Issues Affordability related to value Demographic changes (drop in PA high school graduation rates, expected until 2023) Jim encouraged all alumni to help with recruiting students to make the Juniata name more broadly known Juniata will need to be very diligent and intentional about how to engage the alumni community over the next several years to meet enrollment targets Enrollment is around 80% of our revenue, so the success of this institution is based on our enrollment numbers



- Incoming Class Goal
 - o 420 Freshman
 - o 26 Transfer students
- The last week of April had a slowdown in deposits
- Current Class Expected at 370
- 26 international students coming from 10 different countries are currently committed. The school is feeling good about that
- Juniata is also in the process of working with 6 community colleges to create clearer pathways to Juniata and to graduate in 4 years
- Budgets are built on the expected incoming class, which means that there is going to be a financial impact
 - Wages are going to remain flat for the next year
 - Additionally, health care expenses went up much higher than expected
- We cannot have two successive years of not hitting our number by that much
- There have been times in our history when Juniata has been pushed financially. It is likely that we are going to see a financial impact over the next 8 years.
- We are about to record the best fundraising year ever in the history of this institution by several million dollars
- 2016-2017 was a record year and we have exceeded our goal for the Juniata Scholarship Fund
- We are on pace to reach our \$100 million for the campaign (6 to 7-year campaign)
- Endowment is sitting at the high-water mark (highest ever) at \$115 million. This is about half of our peers and our aspirants
- 25% alumni participation rate: this is high compared to our peers, but it still means that 75% of our alumni do not give back
- The search for the *Dean of Institutional Equity and Inclusive Excellence* failed. The person we made an offer to did not accept because they could not make the move.
- Rob Yelnosky's previous position, VP for Finance & Administration, has been filled. Christine Gibson started yesterday
- Jim talked about a "fine line" being president and feeling more like a coach. There is more positive than negative by far and he believes we will come out of this a stronger institution
