Pivot Team of faculty, staff and administration formed over the summer. 1:40 PM	Senior Leadership comments and discussion	 Believe Campaign - 19 months remaining \$101.5 million so far (52% cash gifts) Juniata spends about 8 cents for every fundraising dollar gained (industry average is 30-40 cents). We are running very lean. With Sally Oberle, Brittani Hayes '20 created a model to assign an engagement score to alumni based on: volunteering, membership on boards, attending events, giving, etc. Would have cost \$ 200K for consultant to create this. Allows us to focus on groups of alumni and specific ways to increase engagement scores. Shows where to spend our time. Allows measurable objective via an aggregate score of all alumni. 50% of all alumni score 0. Chris Blair '92 has the highest score of all alumni! JCEL and Sill Business Incubator are now under the Advancement and Business Departments (Dom Peruso lead for business). Goal of getting JCEL and SBI in the black - now operating with a net gain Welcomes Alumni Council input in deciding the future direction and structure of JCEL and SBI. There are lots of business and entrepreneurial students (undergrad and masters) and they need support. In order to complete all goals, actual number we need from the BELIEVE Campaign is \$121,675,000. (\$7 million more than goal)
