The most events he has planned since it was his main responsibility when he first joined Alumni Office. Alumni Relations is helping with Enrollment Events and Young Alumni Events (as requested by President Troha). The first Young Alumni Event was in Pittsburgh with turnout of 34 people. Very successful - led to huge burst of registrations for March 7 BELIEVE event. Next are State College, Lancaster and DC. Primarily mingling, but hear young alumni concerns and provide updates from JC. Bud and Barb are hosting a BELIEVE Event in Pittsburgh on March 7 at Carnegie Museum of Art. 108 people are registered, including wide variety of alumni, some parents and 9 accepted students! July 24th DC BELIEVE Event will be a mash-up of a Trustee reception, BELIEVE event, Jodie Gray's "Send-off" Picnic and an Enrollment reception, where accepted and prospective students will join. Enrollment has 3 events: one in Lititz that Henry and Joanie Gibbel host, one for Camp Hill hosted by Dan Sunderland at the Westshore Country Club and lastly one in Rockville, Maryland at the Cambria Hotel. Coach Carter, new football coach, will attend at least one of the Enrollment events and will be part of the recruitment process.

However, we found that having 1974 meet last June (while already on campus) worked very well. Therefore, we are planning for 1975 to do the same in 2020. Fun reception with mixing and mingling at the President's House. Classes celebrating their 45th reunion no longer need to come back in the fall. No guarantee on President's House, but we expect 45th to be a trend for June.
 - At Alumni College (during Alumni Weekend) there are strategic asks to faculty now instead of an open invitation. We want to use this opportunity to showcase what faculty are doing (similar to the BELIEVE Kick-off with academic showcases)
 - Bill Phillips, our Nobel Prize winner alum, will be presenting to the campus for Alumni Weekend and Juniata will be honoring him with a special dedication of the Lobby outside Alumni Hall.
- Cathy Closz, Assistant Director of Alumni Relations & Stewardship
 - Since Stewardship is relatively new for Alumni Relations, Cathy gave some highlights
 - The Scholarship Dinner (Generosity Meets Gratitude) in the fall was successful and it will be an annual event. Prior to this, It had been 8 years since such an event was done.
