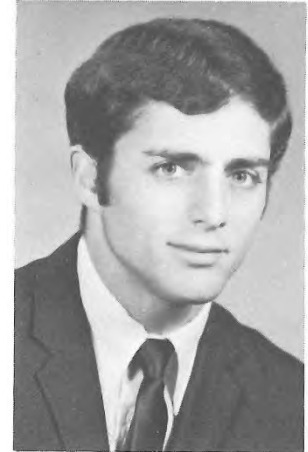

The biggest surprise about retirement is: The powerful perspective of hindsight - which is 20-20.

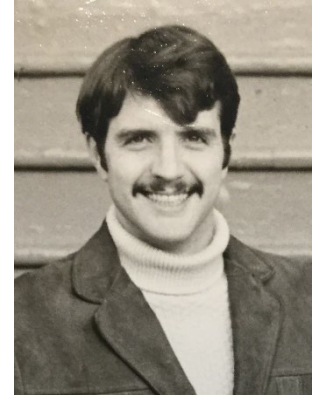
