
Reading Self-Service Progress

1. Reading the Progress bars



- The top bar gives a qualitative summary of how far the student has progressed toward graduating based on credits completed and POE and Gen Ed requirements completed.
- The middle bar gives progress toward completion of the required 120 credits. The dark green (first section) is completed credits, the light green (2nd section) is any credits registered for or in progress and the light brown (3rd section) is credits that are planned.
- The bottom bar gives the same information as the second bar, but without any transfer credits. It isn't particularly helpful.

The middle bar is the most important!

- The dark green should be about 15 times the number of completed semesters.
- Sometimes courses from old semesters contribute to the planned credits and students should be encouraged to remove these credits.

2. Opening and Closing Categories

As a default, Self-Service will close completed categories in the student's Progress. For example, if they have completed FYF, FYC, and FYS, the First Year Experience category will only show this:


If you want to open all the categories to see which courses satisfied the requirements, you can click on *Show Details* several times or you can click on *Expand All* at the top of the list of requirements:

4. Reading General Education Progress & a Primer on Waivers

There are 4 sections for General Education:

- First Year Experience
- Ways of Knowing
- Self and the World
- Connections

The First Year Experience and Connections sections are more straightforward, where a student completes the specific course(s). If a student has coursework that satisfies the requirement for FYC or FYS, this shows directly in the category as a *Noncourse equivalency:*

Ways of Knowing and Self and the World categories share the same structure. In each category, there are 5 designations:

Ways of Knowing

- Creative Expression
- Formal Reasoning
- Humanistic Thought
- Social Inquiry
- Scientific Process

Self and the World

- US Experience
- Ethical Responsibility
- Local Engagement
- Global Engagement I
- Global Engagement II

The first thing to read for each of these categories is the banner at the top:

Ways of Knowing

Complete 5 of the following 9 items.
2 of 5 Completed. Show Details

- Note that **5** items is what is required and the red bold font tells you how many have been completed.
- The 9 total items referred to is a combination of 4 waivers as well as the 5 gen ed designations.
- Considering the waivers, students may receive up to 3 waivers in each of the Ways of Knowing and Self and the World categories for transfer credits and up to 1 waiver in each category for studying abroad (this is always Waiver 4). See waiver information on the Advisors Resources page for more detail.
- The **2 of 5 Completed** tells you only 3 more options need to be completed in this category.

Students may complete any combination of 5 of these 9 options! For example:

- A student may take courses that satisfy all 5 designations.
- A student may transfer courses that meet some of the designations and complete the other courses at Juniata.
- A student may have 3 waivers and take courses that satisfy any 2 of the 5 designations.

This is where advising comes in: after waivers and POE requirements fulfill some requirements, which other designation(s) would be the most beneficial toward helping the student develop as a well-rounded person and meet their professional goals? From the other side, which designation(s) does the student already have experience and does not need to take a course?

This section of Progress is from a last semester senior who brought in 10 transfer credits.

This was not enough transfer credits to earn a waiver and none of the transfer credits transferred as a specific Juniata course with a Gen Ed designation.

This student has completed all 5 requirements for the Ways of Knowing category:

- Creative Expression a Juniata course
- Formal Reasoning a Juniata course
- Humanistic Thought a Juniata course
- Scientific Process the POE waiver since the student is a Biology POE and chose this of the options for that POE
- Social Inquiry a Juniata course

Because all 5 requirements are met, the other options – waivers in this case – are all marked as *Fulfilled*.

This section of Progress is from a first-year student with 35 transfer credits. With 35 transfer credits, the student received:

- A Self and the World Waiver (for the first 12 credits)
- A Ways of Knowing Waiver (for the next 12 credits)
- Specific designations based on transfer equivalencies for courses transferred

This student has completed 3 of 5 options in this category:

- Scientific Process a transferred course where the equivalency satisfied WK-SP
- 2. Social Inquiry a transferred course where the equivalency satisfied WK-SI
- 3. A waiver for the credits transferred in

In addition, the student is currently taking a WK-Humanistic Thought course.


Therefore, after this semester, the student only has one Ways of Knowing requirement to meet. The student might meet this requirement in several ways:

- Taking either a Creative Expression or Formal Reasoning course
- Completing a POE that gives a POE waiver for either Creative Expression or Formal Reasoning
- Studying abroad for a semester, which would give an additional Ways of Knowing waiver (the Study Abroad Waiver is always Waiver 4)


5. Reading POE Progress

Each POE has its own requirements built in Self-Service. Within these POEs, you will see two types of categories just as those noted for General Education:

• Categories where every requirement must be fulfilled – "Complete all of the following items"



 Categories where students have a choice, such as "Complete 1 course" or "Complete 9 credits" from a list



As with General Education, when a requirement is met, then the category closes up.

Special POE Situations

• If the student has more than one POE, as shown by the top of Progress stating "(1 of 2 programs)," click on the arrow next to the POE name to see the requirements for the other POE:



• If a student wants to look at requirements for a designated POE other than the one they currently have on record, they can select *View a New Program* at the top of the Progress.



- 6. **Secondary Emphasis:** If the student has a Secondary Emphasis, those requirements are listed below the POE requirements and work similarly.
- 7. **Other Courses**: Any courses not counted for General Education, POE, or Secondary Emphasis appear as *Other Courses*. This category contains electives, but may include courses for a second POE.
